The “Voices” multi–media tour will guide visitors across the historic grounds with its ancient live oaks, broad vistas, vanished structures, and rare period features, to reveal the layers of history embedded within. For the first time, viewers have access to the many resources in Drayton Halls’ archives that depict how the site has changed over the centuries. Eighteenth– and nineteenth–century maps and drawings, historic and modern–day photographs, archaeological artifacts, family possessions, and audio and video recordings of members of the Drayton family, the Bowens family and other descendants of enslaved people, scholars, and staff, show how human history and natural history have combined and shaped one another to make Drayton Hall a national treasure.
