CHARLESTON AREA PRESERVATION AND CONSERVATION PARTNERS CONDUCT CUTTING EDGE HI-DEFINITION AERIAL LIDAR SURVEY

CHARLESTON, SC MARCH 22, 2022: Charleston Area preservation and conservation partners have joined forces to conduct a high-definition light detecting and ranging survey (LiDAR) across the entire 72.8 square miles that make up the Ashley River Historic District. Once complete, the LiDAR survey will provide a detailed photogrammetric and topographic map with high-definition 3D imagery at a 2-centimeter accuracy. Such information will ultimately improve the understanding of the cultural and natural resources located within the district.

Regional partners include Drayton Hall Preservation Trust, The Coastal Conservation League, Dorchester Trust, Historic Charleston Foundation, Lowcountry Land Trust, Magnolia Plantation Foundation, Middleton Place Foundation, The National Trust for Historic Preservation, and the Preservation Society of Charleston.

The survey conducted across the district's 23,000 acres will help identify undiscovered historic sites and unique natural features. With a heightened understanding of topography and particularly hydrology, better informed decisions can be made ahead of road construction, zoning, and development.

"Our partners are deeply committed to active research and the long-term preservation of the Ashley River Historic District. Not only does this area contain some of the most significant historical sites from American History, but the surviving natural landscape is unique among South Carolina and the wider nation," says Carter C. Hudgins, President and CEO of Drayton Hall Preservation Trust.
